Mosman Art Gallery is proud to present this unique exhibition spanning twelve years of David Fairbairn's recent art practice, focussing on his signature style and artworks — his large scale expressive portraits. Accompanied by medium and smaller sized works, this exhibition reveals the dedication, skill and insight into portraiture that confirms David Fairbairn to be one of Australia's leading contemporary draughtsmen.

David Fairbairn has enjoyed a successful art career since the mid 1970s. He has exhibited in solo and group exhibitions extensively and is represented by commercial galleries in Melbourne and Sydney. The Doug Moran National Portrait Prize, the Dobell Drawing Prize and the Kedumba Drawing Award are just some of the many accolades that Fairbairn has been awarded attesting to the significance of his work and practice.

David Fairbairn defines himself first and foremost as a draughtsman, not a painter. *Lineage* is aptly titled, referring both to the thread of imagery within the exhibition, and the strong physicality of the Fairbairn's robust use of line. His compelling images incorporate an array of art media, however it is his line work that unifies the disparate elements within his images.

Fairbairn's history as an artist goes back to his early childhood years. He was born in 1949 in Zambia, South Africa. He subsequently spent most of his first nine years in West Africa, prior to attending boarding school in England. His father was a mining engineer, based in Nigeria, Sierra Leone and Liberia. It was this association with African culture that led to a broad interest in African art, which in turn resulted in his strong appreciation for Oceanic, Aboriginal and Papua New Guinea art and culture.

These early cultural influences have informed David Fairbairn's art practice, in particular traditional tribal masks. Two such masks originally owned by his father, have since been handed down to the artist and now hang in his home, a constant reminder of his personal history and a strong influence on his early portraits.

Lineage is a comprehensive body of work forming an impressive exhibition, which clearly illustrates David Fairbairn's masterly use of line, the power and immediacy of his mark, and his unique insights into the human condition.
