Operation Instructions

Each bottle is lit by an LED torch, glued underneath its base and concealed within each plinth. The bottles are secured with a silicon seal, and the torches are secured with a layer of araldite, coated by a silicon seal.

To turn on:

Lift each lid by the bottle (try to avoid lifting it around its label, as they are prone to unsticking) to reveal the torch beneath it.

Push the switch **up** to turn on.

Replace the apparatus and ensure the lid is fairly square upon the plinth base.

To turn off:

Repeat the above, flicking the switch **down** instead.

The torches used emit very little heat, and consume less energy than regular light bulbs. They also last longer. These should last the duration of the exhibition, provided they are supplied with fresh batteries.

If the batteries require replacing, I have provided a total of 16 D-sized batteries.

To replace batteries:

Lift each lid by the bottle.

Holding the bottle, gently unscrew the torch from the lens. The lens should remain adhered to the base of the bottle.

Replace the torch with two, fresh D-sizes batteries (supplied)

Gently screw the torch back onto the base.

Replace the apparatus upon its plinth.

If you run out of batteries:
